• Phonics: Letter sound of the week **qu**. Go to youtube jollyphonics for **qu** song and activities to do.

Tell your child that the letter **q** always has his friend **u** with it and together they make the **qu** sound.

Show your child how to write the letter q.

Can you draw pictures of things beginning with **q** and label them. Look for the letter **q** in books.

Rhyme of the week: log onto topmarks.co.uk. Type nursery rhymes into search.

Find Hickory Dickory Dock and sing it with your child.

Writing: Make sentences with the new words likes, helps in your copy.

Don't forget to leave a space between each word.
